### This Week's Message

There are some big words coming up and as Olwyn suggested, I should explain these.

**Redemptive** – describes the God-glorifying, God-honouring quality of our relationships and how they point others towards Jesus, and even leads other Christians closer to Jesus.

**Reconciliation** – restoring a broken relationship, making amends. The beautiful thing about Christian reconciliation is that God initiates it and brings it about. It's profoundly restorative at soul level rather than just relationally. Accepting this one way of restorative justice is mind blowingly life changing.

**Nurturing** speaks of our mindfulness in relationships and our motivation to love and care.

I'm so pleased as Christians we do not do this on our own steam, because as Spirit filled believers, Christ's love overflows towards others through us.

We actually don't lead people to Christ either. God does the calling of people back to himself, but he needs a physical person to love them out of their socks of complacency. Jesus calls us to be genuinely our authentic selves using the little gifts he has given us to love love and love people. In real life and as imperfect as we are, limited by our gifting and understanding of just how big and awesome our God is, mission will take detours, that's why we need each other to reach our missional goals.
